# 1. SCOPE AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCUREMENT

## 1.1. Legal basis: what are the rules?

This tender is governed by the provisions of:

- the Financial regulation of the European Schools and
- Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 July 2018 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union (the Financial Regulation)<sup>1</sup>.

# 1.2. Subject: what is this call for tenders about?

The subject of this call for tenders is an acquisition with installation of 156 lockers for our teachers:

- 96 for secondary teachers (8 modules of 3x4).
- 60 for primary teachers (5 modules of 3x4).

#### 1.3. Lots: is this call for tenders divided into lots?

This call for tender is not divided into lots since all lockers are intended to be made of the same material with the same consistency and aesthetic finish.

# 1.4. Description: what do we want to buy through this call for tenders (minimal technical specifications)?

The supplies, subject of this call for tender, including any minimum requirements, are described in detail below.

Variants (alternatives to the model solution described in the Tender Specifications) are not allowed. The Contracting authority will disregard any variants described in a tender.

## 1.4.1. Background and objectives

The contracting authority is the European School of Mol, located in the municipality of Mol (Belgium), where more than 150 teachers are currently employed in three cycles of study (nursery, primary and secondary) as well as three linguistic sections.

These teachers currently do not have lockers where they can store books, teaching materials or computers, or where they can receive external correspondence or homeworks from their pupils or documents from their co-workers, etc.

The *contracting authority* wishes to conclude a contract for the provision of new lockers with dual access key and combinations code for 156 teachers (96 for secondary and 60 for primary).

The objective is to ensure teachers have access to lockers by a personal code in order to receive correspondence and keep materials safe. The school also wishes to have a master key to access the lockers.


# 1.4.2. Technical description

Tenderers are committed to the provision and the quality of the items listed below.

Any tender which will not meet all these minimum requirements will be considered irregular and will not be taken into consideration in the evaluation process.

Proposed supplies must meet the MINIMUM requirements listed in the following points.

# DOOR DESCRIPTION:

- 90° side opening minimum

- Rubber dots, or rubber strips to cushion shocks and noises when closing the doors.
- Double hinge rod (thickness 6 mm minimum)
- Padlocks mounted on a reinforced blade concealed on the inside of the door (welds, hardware or screws not visible from the outside)
- Required: Card holder/ Pocket to insert and replace name tags.

# 1.4.3. Special executions conditions

Environmental conditions: In accordance with the object of the contract, the paints and materials to be applied must have environmentally friendly labels and environmentally friendly. Also packaging (plastics, cardboard, etc.) must be recycled and deposited in a specific container for treatment and waste, depending on the material.

## 1.5. Place of performance: where will the contract be performed?

The lockers will be installed inside the:

- Secondary building (1st floor) and
- Primary Education building (Ground floor).

The contractor must inform the contracting authority of the exact delivery date at least 3 working days in advance. All deliveries must take place between 8:00 hours to 15:45 hours at the place agreed for this purpose.

#### 1.6. Nature of the contract: how will the contract be implemented?

The procedure will result in the conclusion of a direct contract. Once signed, it can be implemented directly without any further contract procedures.

☐ Tenderers need to take full account of the provisions of the Draft contract as the latter will define and govern the contractual relationship(s) to be established between the Contracting authority and the successful tenderer(s). Special attention is to be paid to the provisions specifying the rights and obligations of the contractor, in particular those on payments, performance of the contract, confidentiality, and checks and audits.

#### 1.7. Volume and value of the contract: how much do we plan to buy?

The estimated total amount of all purchases under this contract is TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND EUROS (25.000,00€ excl. VAT), itemized in a maximum unit price of 1.923,08€ for each cupboard-module of lockers (13 modules (3x4 lockers) in total).

# 1.8. Duration of the contract: how long do we plan to use the contract?

The contract or purchase order resulting from the award of this call for tenders will be concluded for a maximum of three (3) months, starting from the signing of the contract. Within this period, the components must have been manufactured, delivered and correctly installed for perfect commissioning. If possible, the aim is to have the lockers installed is before the beginning of the 2022/2023 academic year, which starts 1 September 2022.

## 2. EVALUATION AND AWARD

The evaluation of the tenders that comply with the submission conditions will consist of the following elements:

- Check if the tenderer has access to procurement;
- Verification of non-exclusion of tenderers on the basis of the exclusion criteria;
- Selection of tenderers on the basis of selection criteria;
- Verification of compliance with the minimum requirements defined in the Tender specifications;
- Evaluation of tenders on the basis of the award criteria.

The *Contracting authority* will evaluate the abovementioned elements in the order that it considers to be the most appropriate. If the evaluation of one or more elements demonstrates that there are grounds for rejection, the tender will be rejected and will not be subjected to further full evaluation.

The unsuccessful tenderers will be informed of the ground for rejection without being given feedback on the non-assessed content of their tenders. Only tenderer(s) for whom the verification of all elements did not reveal grounds for rejection can be awarded the contract.

The evaluation will be based on the information and evidence contained in the tenders and, if applicable, on additional information and evidence provided at the request of the Contracting authority during the procedure.

For the purposes of the evaluation related to exclusion and selection criteria the Contracting authority may also refer to publicly available information, in particular evidence that it can access on a national database free of charge.

#### 2.1. Exclusion criteria

The objective of the exclusion criteria is to assess whether the tenderer is in any of the exclusion situations listed in Article 136 (1) of the Financial Regulation.

As evidence of non-exclusion each tenderer needs to submit with its tender a Declaration on Honour in the model annexed. The declaration must be signed by an authorised representative of the entity providing the declaration.

The initial verification of non-exclusion of tenderers will be done on the basis of the submitted declarations. The documents mentioned as supporting evidence in the Declaration on Honour need to be provided whenever requested and where this is necessary to ensure the proper conduct of the procedure within a deadline given by the Contracting authority<sup>2</sup>.

#### 2.2. Selection criteria

The objective of the selection criteria is to assess whether the tenderer has the legal, regulatory, economic, financial, technical and professional capacity to perform the contract.

The selection criteria for this call for tenders, including the minimum levels of capacity, the basis for assessment and the evidence required, are specified in the following subsections.

Tenders submitted by tenderers not meeting the minimum levels of capacity will be rejected.

When submitting its tender each tenderer shall declare on honour that it fulfils the selection criteria for the call for tender. The model Declaration on Honour annexed shall be used. The declaration must be signed by an authorised representative of the entity providing the declaration.

The initial assessment of whether a tenderer fulfils the selection criteria will be done on the basis of the submitted declaration(s).

The subsections below specify which selection criteria evidence must be provided with the tender, or may be requested later at any time during the procurement procedure<sup>3</sup>.

Please note that a request for evidence in no way implies that the tenderer has been successful.

#### 2.2.1. Legal and regulatory capacity

Tenderers must prove that they have legal capacity to perform the contract and the regulatory capacity to pursue the professional activity necessary to carry out the work subject to this call for tenders.

The legal and regulatory capacity shall be proven by the evidence listed below:

- Proof of enrolment in a relevant trade or professional register
- Proof of authorisation that the tenderer is authorised to perform the contract in its country of establishment
- Proof that the tenderer is a member of a specific professional organisation

#### 2.2.2. Economic and financial capacity

Tenderers must comply with the following selection criteria in order to prove that they have the necessary economic and financial capacity to perform the contract.

# 2.2.3. Technical and professional capacity

Tenderers must comply with the following selection criteria in order to prove that they have the necessary technical and professional capacity to perform the contract.

# 2.3. Compliance with the minimum requirements of the Tender specifications

By submitting a tender, a tenderer commits to perform the contract in full compliance with the terms and conditions of the procurement documents for this call for tender. Particular attention is drawn to the minimum requirements specified in Section 1.4 of these specifications and to the fact that tenders must comply with applicable data protection, environmental, social and labour law obligations established by Union law, national legislation, collective agreements or the international environmental, social and labour conventions listed in Annex X to Directive 2014/24/EU.

The minimum requirements shall be observed throughout the entire duration of the contract. Compliance with these requirements is mandatory and cannot be subject to any assumptions, limitations, conditions, or reservations on the part of a tenderer.

#### 2.4. Award criteria

The objective of the award criteria is to evaluate the tenders with a view to choosing the most economically advantageous tender.

Tenders will be evaluated on the basis of the following award criteria and their weighting:

# 2.5. Award (ranking of tenders)

Tenders shall be ranked according to the best price-quality ratio in accordance with the formula below:

Cr. P1 \*(weight) + Cr. Q2 \* (weight) + Cr. Q3 \*(weight) + Cr. Q4 \*(weight) + Cr. Q5 \*(weight) + Cr. Q6 \*(weight) = Total score

☐ The contract shall be awarded to the tender ranked first, which complies with the Tender Specifications and is submitted by a tenderer having access to procurement, not in an exclusion situation and fulfilling with the selection criteria.

Tenders are to be submitted according to the instructions laid down in the Invitation to tender letter.
